

**Announcement No. SHE 001/2026**  
**Re: Environment Policy**

Namyong Terminal Public Company Limited and its subsidiaries (“the Company”) is committed to promote the environmental-friendly business operation by paying attention to efficient use of resources, energy conservation, development of the business process that constantly protects the environment and prevent pollution, as well as encouragement of personnel to have environmental and social responsibility knowledge and awareness for sustainable development. The Company, therefore, prescribes this policy to impose the following duties to all of the executives and employees to cooperatively implement the efficient and continuous environmental management:

1. comply with and promptly monitor any regulations, laws, rules, as well as contractual obligations and any amendment thereof that are related to all stakeholders;
2. assess and review the risks and opportunities that may affect the environmental management, as well as impose preventive measures to reduce the environmental impact for the further improvement continuously including setting guidelines and encouraging resource conservation and using renewable energy from the Company’s activities to align with the national strategic plan due to Thailand’s ambition at COP26 in Glasgow solving the problem of climate change to achieve Net Zero Emission in the year B.E. 2608 (2065) and Carbon Neutral in the year B.E. 2593 (2050);
3. encourage, support, setting goals and plans for reducing environmental impacts from the Company’s business process and its supply chain for dealing with climate change by efficient and sustainable use of resources, as well as increase the opportunity to improve the operation, initiate cost-reduction project, reduce greenhouse gas emission, and implement and apply proper technology and innovation to maximize the efficiency to support the national strategic plan and the strategy of the Thai Ports Authority;
4. set measures and process in accordance with the measures in the Environmental Impact Assessment or EIA reports;
5. encourage and support the essential resources in aspects of personnel, expenditure, tools, time, and training, as well as promote participation of employees in activities; and
6. encourage and support communication and education to the employees, business partners, customers, visitors and stakeholders to be aware of the environment.
